Year 3 & 4

Year 3 and 4 are studying Monarchy in History this term. In our lesson this week the children came up with three new laws that they would introduce if they were the King or Queen. They then made crowns to wear and sat on the 'throne' at the front of the class in character and described their new laws while other members of the class challenged them and gave their opinions. Some of the Kings and Queens were very eccentric!







Year 1 & 2

Year 1 and 2 have been looking at toys from the early 20th century this week. They observed the materials that they were made from and how they are similar to toys that they still play with today. We discussed the fact that Teddy Bears are named after Theodore Roosevelt, the 26th American president. The children enjoyed drawing pictures of their favourite toys and describing them to their friends.



Year 5 & 6

Y5/6 are investigating light this half term. We conducted an experiment to find out if we could change the size of shadows without changing the object. Using our own puppet templates, we discovered that moving the object closer to the light source made a bigger.
